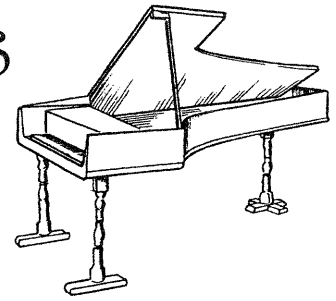


# Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart

## Geography: Travel During Mozart's Time

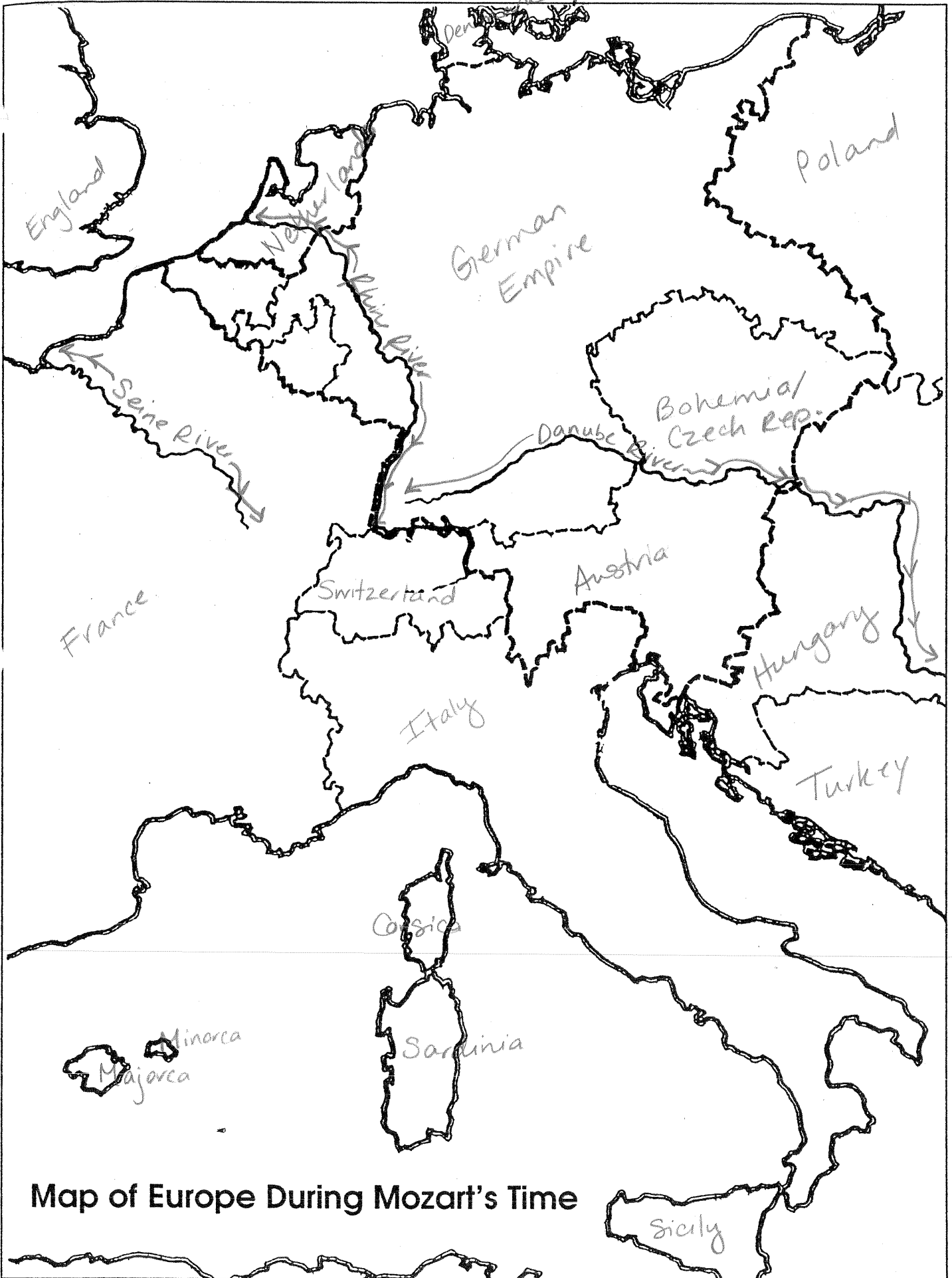
Ships were made of wood and had sails. Steam engines and motors had not been invented. Trains were invented in the early 1800s. Automobiles only appeared about 1900. The journeys with horse-drawn carriages were rough and slow. The inns were cold, damp and dirty. Depending on the weather, a trip that takes today only a few hours took days or even weeks. Wolfgang traveled about 250 days in his life.
